

**RESOLUTION NO. 08-506**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON,  
CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF JAMEY  
KIBLINGER AS POLICE CHIEF AND AUTHORIZING THE  
MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT.**

**WHEREAS**, Rick Luther retired as the City of Black Diamond's Police Chief at the end of 2007; and

**WHEREAS**, the Civil Service Commission recommended an internal recruitment process to fill the vacant position of Police Chief; and

**WHEREAS**, Ms. Kiblinger applied for the position and was interviewed by the Civil Service Commission on May 1, 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, the Civil Service Commission recommended the appointment of Ms. Kiblinger to the position of Police Chief; and

**WHEREAS**, Jamey Kiblinger has served as the Acting Police Chief since Mr. Luther's departure and as Commander prior to that; and

**WHEREAS**, Ms. Kiblinger has proven to be a public servant dedicated to protecting and serving the citizens of Black Diamond; and

**WHEREAS**, Ms. Kiblinger was hired by the City of Black Diamond as a police officer and has steadily promoted through the ranks over the last ten years; and


**WHEREAS**, the Council supports the Mayor's selection of Ms. Kiblinger and finds the proposed agreement to be fair and reasonable;

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND,  
WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** The City Council of the City of Black Diamond, Washington, does hereby confirm the Mayor's appointment of Jamey Kiblinger as Police Chief and authorizes the Mayor, on behalf of the City, to execute an employment agreement.
