

RESOLUTION NO. 08-509

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT A 2009 KING COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CONSORTIUM FUNDING APPLICATION.

WHEREAS, King County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds support projects that benefit low- to moderate income residents; and

WHEREAS, eligible projects for funds include community facilities, public improvements, parks, minor housing repair and other activities; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 funding cycle for King County CDBG funds includes \$1.1 million for the south sub-region cities; and

WHEREAS, Black Diamond previously installed sidewalks on Morgan Street from Baker Street to Abrams Avenue using county CDBG funds; and

WHEREAS, the Morgan Street sidewalk construction project was listed as priority project number three on the City's Transportation Improvement Program adopted by the City Council in July 2007; and

WHEREAS, the 1,900-foot sidewalk construction project would complete the connection of homes on Morgan Street with Black Diamond Elementary School and Roberts Drive; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Board reconstruction road grant for Jones Lake Road requires a connection from the Old Town District to the Morgan Street sidewalk to promote pedestrian safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. The Mayor is authorized to make formal application to King County for funding assistance;

Section 3. This resolution becomes part of a formal application to King County.


