City of Black Diamond Withdraw and Reissue of a SEPA Determination of Mitigated Non-Significance (MDNS)

This MDNS was originally issued on September 6, 2016. It was discovered that the SEPA checklist was not included in the MDNS mailed to tribes and agencies with jurisdiction. Therefore, in order to meet SEPA requirements, the City has elected to withdraw and reissue the MDNS for PLN16-0031.

Project Location: The site is generally within the southwestern quarter of Section 15, Township 21N, Range 6 East, entirely within the city limits of Black Diamond, WA. Work would be done in the vicinity of Willow Avenue on the south side of Roberts Drive, across Roberts Drive, and continuing on the west side of Lake Sawyer Rd SE.

Project Description: The applicant proposes to construct 1,593 linear feet of sewer pipe, 1,557 feet of 12" pipe to extend to a sewer force main and 36 feet of 8' pipe that will gravity flow the pumped effluent into the King County Metro sewer main located in the Lake Sawyer Road. A meter vault may also be installed over the force main (if needed) to allow a flow meter to be installed in the pipe in order to monitor flows through the force main. The proposed work would be performed within the Robert's Drive and Lake Sawyer Road S.E. right-of-way (ROW).

You must make specific factual objections, identifying error or harm suffered, or identify anticipated relief sought and raise specific issues in the statement of appeal. Mitigation Measures: The required mitigation measures listed below re imposed as conditions of development in response to the City's review of this information.

- 1. Provide a Temporary Erosion and Sediment Control (TESC) and Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans in association with the development permit application and apply best management practices (BMPs) as approved by the City prior to commencement of work.
- 2. Restore and stabilize site immediately after construction with hydro seeding or installation of straw or jute mats.
- 3. Use BMPs to control emissions resulting from construction activities including minimizing vehicle and equipment idling.
- 4. Control dust and other particulates by street sweeping and watering site.
- 5. Adhere to state regulations for safe handling and spill prevention of all hazardous materials.
- 6. Adhere to working hours in the Villages MPD Development Agreement dated December 12, 2011 to limit potential impacts of construction noise.
- 7. Provide a Traffic Control Plan in association with the development permit to manage vehicle stoppages from construction activities.
